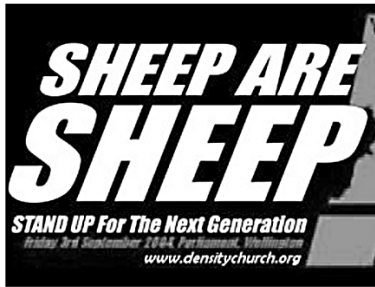


The Density Church — enough is *never* enough

Inner-city cafe will take the grind out of your day

You have probably walked past City Grind 100 times and never noticed because it is tucked away behind a long narrow entrance on Lorne Street. Here you will find Auckland's best kept secret.

City Grind café opened early this year and has been steadily growing in popularity. And quite rightly so.

It is the epitome of serene garden dining in the bustle of city life. You know that outside

food and fantastic coffee. It's the perfect mix of urban chic and back-to-nature.

Despite being technically out-

doors, there is no need to avoid City Grind on cold days. On the contrary. It's covered with a transparent cover to use the natural sunlight and it's heated by those glorious Jafa inventions... the stand alone outdoor heater.

After your first visit you are on a first name basis with the staff who provide an incredibly high level of service. Food is presented beautifully, without delay, and plates are cleared the second you put your knife and fork on the scraped-clean plate.

Another distinguishing feature that City Grind has to offer is their big breakfast.

This is the kind of big breakfast that leaves other big breakfasts for dead. We're talking eggs, bacon, hash browns, toast, sausages and grilled tomatoes with cheese. The whole shebang for only \$8.50. When most places

charge around the \$14 mark, City Grind is the Freedom Air of cafes and we are all eternally grateful. Oh and we forgot to mention, the \$8.50 includes a coffee... a damn good coffee too.

There is only one gripe to be had and that's the \$4 juice which was poured from a bottle, not freshly squeezed as the price implied. It was poured from a boring old out-of-mum's-fridge bottle of juice. Jo felt cheated.

However, it could be said that City Grind's generosity is concentrated into the important things. Coffee cards are readily presented and require only six coffee purchases (not the usual 10) before you get a free cup. Love it.

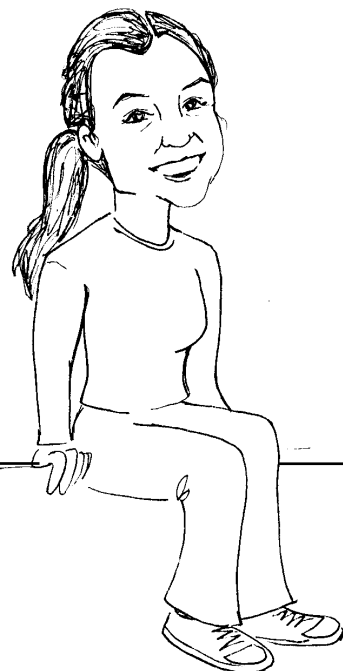
STATIC 88.1 FM
