The pair met in school and always had an interest in wrestling, but they joined forces only recently, says Lucid.

and will truck no argument from those who claim the fights are staged, or that it is somehow a joke.

Solid believes that those who have a problem with the fact the fights might be rehearsed need to change their perspective on the sport.
